


Ultrasound Guided Venous Access Longitudinal Approach

Veins will appear tubular running lengthwise across the screen. "Rock" your linear probe to see the artery and vein in order to make the differentiation. Insert your needle, with the bevel facing up at a 45° angle. Advance the needle slowly pulling on the plunger with your thumb, look for the blood "flash".







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
